SACRED MUSIC

Did you know that Byzantine chant music is monophonic? That means that it is structured around eight tones (modes). These tones form multiple patterns which make the music sound rich and diverse. When there is more than one chanter, there may be a complimentary part, a single note that blends with the melody, called a drone or ison. Chant is also atonal, which means that it doesn't follow an organized meter the same way that choral music does. Instead, it follows the speech patterns of the text and the form of the particular melody in which it is sung. (*From GreekBoston.com and Sacred Music Institutes*)

A REVIEW FROM OUR BOOKSTORE

Garden in the East: The Spiritual Life of the Body by Angela Doll Carlson

In this book, being read by our Women's Group (AOCWNA) this summer, the author compares our body to an amazing garden of God's creation. She explores a spiritual relationship to our body versus the look-orientated, fad-orientated view of our culture. *Garden in the East* is like a chat over coffee with a very close friend, filled with lots of details about her personal and daily life, and it encourages us to pause and take stock of our relationship to this gift God has given us. Here is a quote:

But no matter what my eyes report, there is beauty that lives under the skin, under the surface, under the standards set up for me by the arbiters of what is good and true. Those arbiters are not always so reliable. They can be bought and sold. They can be marketed and manufactured. The real standards, the ones set forth by the One who made me, are solid, knitted into me at my beginning. This beauty is true and real, and it lives within the heart. It is my *heart* that must be trained to recognize this beauty. (p. 58).

“Why is there so much evil in the world today? Because people have thrown away their most reliable weapon, the all-victorious weapon with which every evil, every sin and every demon are assuredly vanquished on all battlefields. And this weapon is—prayer and fasting.
